

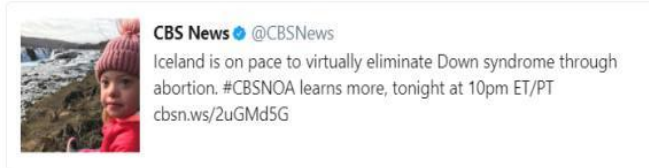
Eradicated?
